

The Story of a Second Story: Topping Off a Ranch Style House

By putting off the basement and porch for now, simplifying the renovation, installing toilets back-to-back, and using some great suggestions from Framing/Crew Leader Matt Shirk, we were able to save the family thousands of dollars.



Once the new plans were squared away, says Kathy, the project itself was relatively

painless. "I anticipated a lot more problems than I actually had," she says. "Even the problems that did come up were usually solved without me having to get involved. If I had a problem, I'd call Matt and ask what to do. Usually he'd say he had already taken care of it."

Although a large renovation like this one can be daunting, the Soissons not only adapted well, but even enjoyed much of the process. "The kids memorized whose truck is whose," Kathy says. "They'd look out the window, then run in and scream, 'They're here!' The crew

would joke around with them, and even gave my youngest a tool to let him pretend like he was working."


Jack and Jill...and Julian?"
